RESPECT NAME AND PRONOUNS

- -Normalize the use of pronouns in introductions with everyone, not just people you think may be transgender
- -Lead by example:

My name is Dr. Smith, my pronouns are he/him

ONLY RELY ON MCP OR ID CARDS

- -Changing documentation takes time and money
- -Continue to respect name and pronouns even if MCP hasn't been updated

ASSESS THE NEEDS OF THE PATIENT

- -The bodies of trans patients may look different from expectations associated with a particular gender
- -Treat the needs of the body, do not assume body parts based on gender expression or identity

GENDER BODY PARTS OR PROCEDURES

- -This invalidates experiences of trans, non binary, and intersex folks
- -Patient may have physical health needs based on their sex assigned at birth
- -For example, trans men may need pap exams and trans women may need prostate exams

BE KNOWLEDGEABLE ABOUT YOUR PATIENT

- -Ensure you have all accurate and <u>relevant</u> information
- -If in doubt respectfully ask the patient

ASK QUESTIONS IRRELEVANT FOR TREATMENT

- -Most treatment does not require information about a patient's genitals, surgeries, or coming out story etc
- -Keep questions relevant to present treatment needs
